### Why do the Homeless need socks?

- 1. They rarely take them off. Socks protect the feet from nature's elements, the heat, the cold, bugs.
- 2. There is rarely the opportunity to do their laundry, so they just wear the socks until they get a new pair.
- 3. Financial priorities do not include socks or other underclothes.
- 4. Because of ill-fitting shoes or no shoes at all, socks wear out quickly and become holey. Long toenails or callous also wear on the sock's conditions.
- Individuals who are homeless have limited access to showering. When they wash up their feet is not usually priority. Body sweat and dirt wear on socks.
- 6. Many homeless do not have proper footwear and their socks serve as their shoes. When they have ill-fitting footwear that they wear without socks, it causes blisters.
- 7. Many homeless have health conditions that cause poor circulation. Injuries to the feet and the lack of health care can quickly compromise their health. Clean socks can serve as a deterrent to this.

The 2022-2023 MD 11 Service Project was an incredible and impressive success. The District Global Service Coordinators and District Governors out did themselves getting information out to the districts about not only the challenge but the NEED. Because of all the work done, over 19,000 pairs of socks were distributed to agencies throughout Michigan who serve those in need. The socks were donated by individual Lions, Clubs and Manufacturers.

The Sock-Hop at the MD 11 State Convention brought the districts together to celebrate our success with Popcorn donated by PDG Ron Riebschleger and his wife Tracy, and wonderful Root beer Floats. At the event we donated nearly 1,000 pairs of socks to Every Woman's Place Shelter in Muskegon. It was wonderful to have their staff also join us in the Parade.

# DISTRICT GOVERNOR'S **Spotlight**

When I was installed as a Lion some 20 plus years ago, one thing the dignitary doing the ceremony said has always stuck in my mind. He asked us to look at our Lions emblem and said, "notice it has two heads on it facing opposite directions- one looking at our past and one looking at our future". I find this important as we are ending our Lionistic year and starting the new one. It is a good time to look back on the past year and evaluate your personal, your clubs, and even your Districts' successes over the past year. But also, your events and goals that may have fallen short of expectations. It is important for us as an organization to evaluate ourselves, to learn from our experiences, and to use them as a building block for our growth in the future.

As a Lion did you set any personal goals this past year? Did you have anything you wanted to achieve or do? Look back at this past year and see how you have grown. Maybe you took some training courses or seminars. Maybe you stepped up into a new office or chaired an event for the first time. Maybe you sponsored a new member or two and became their mentor or became a more active member within your Zone or District. Now look at your club. Ask yourselves about how you feel your club did. Did you have a successful year, or do you think there's still room for improvement? Could you have done something different to make a successful event even better? Did your membership grow or decline and what can you do to improve upon it? I know not all clubs are the same, so the measuring stick is different for each of you. This is why you must do a self-evaluation.

As my year as District Governor is ending, I am looking back over the past year that has flown by. Before the year started, we had to submit goals for our Districts to International. These are good measuring points to begin our self-evaluation. Were these goals realistic or did we set them too ambitiously? Did we meet the goals or how close were we to achieving them? Of course, the goals are not the only thing to base our success on. I look back at our Zone and Cabinet meetings. Were they well attended and organized? Did the business get done that needed to be? And lastly, was the fellowship of those in attendance lively, interactive, and energetic? I also look back at training sessions. How well were they attended and what was the feedback? Did you do a District wide project? What was the participation like and did those Lions have a positive vibe and energy level? These are just a few of the hundreds of things to look at.

Even the smallest steps of growth as a Lion are important as they help strengthen you internally but also help to strengthen your club which in turn strengthens the District and our overall organization. Now what about looking ahead? Are you ready to build upon this past year? I am reminded of a quote from Thomas Edison on the invention of the light bulb. It took him thousands of attempts to get the result. To paraphrase him when asked about it, "I never once failed in my attempt, I just found 10,000 ways that didn't work". We need to use the same mindset moving forward to this next year. Look back at the results to your goals and events from the past year and see ways that could be improved on. It doesn't have to be a complete overhaul, maybe just a minor tweak here or there. These small changes could lead to huge gains.

We as Lions need to continue to grow. The world around us is changing faster than we can keep up. But we must try. We cannot continue to be complacent. The world needs us more now than ever. We must rise up to the challenge and get out there to serve as many people as we can. Take the time to look and what you have done, how you have done it, and what your end product was, then make some positive adjustments to them and continue to build yourselves stronger. In the end we will all be better for it.



### Make a Lions Club Media Kit

A media kit, otherwise referred to as a press kit, is a package of promotional materials about your Lions Club and prominent individual members that's given to media sources. The kit generally

includes a variety of descriptive and promotional information about your Club. Press kits are often used to introduce new media outlets and media people to your Lions Club. See https://www.lionsclubs.org/en/resources-for-members/ brand-guidelines for Lions International's media kit resources.

A media kit makes it easy for your Lions Club's media contacts to access accurate written information, images, and videos about you. It also allows you to have greater control over the materials that the media uses to represent your Lions Club brand, ensuring any facts and statistics that the media uses are accurate and that the images are of high quality.

There are several essential pieces to include in a media or press kit, such as:

• Story -- You should include the story about how your Lions Club came to be. You may want to include the problem or opportunity that led you to create your local Lions Club or whether there was a specific mission in mind when the Club was founded.

• Facts and statistics -- It's important to include facts and statistics that the media can refer to when publishing stories on you. Some facts you may want to include are the number of people you serve, the number of years you have been in operation, and the geographical area in which you operate.

• High-resolution images and videos -- You should also include high-quality images and videos that the media can download and use. You may also want to include high-quality versions of Lions logos. Providing high-resolution images allows you to have greater control over your brand image and the way your Lions Club is perceived.

Here are the steps you should take to create an effective media kit:

1. Determine the purpose of the media kit -- It's important to start the process of creating a kit by understanding how you want to use it, as this will determine the type of images and information you include. Most use a media kit for one of the following reasons:

• If you're introducing a new program or service, then your media kit likely will focus on not only Lions Club information, but also on program or service details and features.

• If you're launching a new Lions Club, then your media kit should include information about the Club's formation, what you offer the community, and the story behind why you launched your Lions Club.

• If you're trying to promote an event, then a media kit is beneficial since it provides all of the important information that local news outlets will need.

2. Include contact information -- The next step is to decide who will be the primary contact listed in the media kit's materials if someone in the media has questions or wants more information about an event, program, or service or about your Lions Club in general. You should include the name of the primary contact, their email address, phone number, location, Facebook page, and website.

3. Create your story -- The next step you should take is to create your Lions Club's story, where you describe the history of your Club, the mission it was founded upon and the events, programs, and services that it promotes. This part of the media kit is typically referred to as an overview. Your story should be between 50 and 100 words long and be tailored to the purpose of the media kit.

4. Compile facts about your Lions Club and its service area -- After writing your general descriptive history, the next step you should take is to create a list of five to 10 facts about your Lions Club, events, or services. They should be relevant to the purpose of your media kit and make it easy for the media to create compelling content. Some information you'll want to provide in the fact sheet may include:



- Location of meetings, including day, time and frequency
- Number of members
- Number of people in your service area
- Notable members and short biographies
- Annual donations
- Types of services
- Interesting facts about your services
- General information about recurring events
- Media mentions
- Historical milestones

5. Gather photos -- Next, you should gather high-quality images of your logos, photos of past events, members, and geographic location. To ensure logos are used in a way that remains in alignment with your brand, it's generally a good idea to provide branding guidelines for how and where the media can use them. See Lions International's https://www.lionsclubs.org/resources/81104618. You can use smaller images throughout your media kit to add visual appeal and make it more informative. Mention whether the photos are available for publication and include links to downloadable, high-resolution images.

6. Create member bios -- You should include brief biographies and headshots for each prominent person. At a minimum, the media kit should contain headshots and bios for the president. However, if there are multiple members in charge of certain programs or operations, you may want to include their bios and photos in the media kit as well. If you're promoting an event, then your media kit should have the bios and headshots for the key members who are responsible for the event.

7. Link to other press releases -- Depending on the purpose of your media kit, you may want to include links to past, relevant press releases. Organize the list of press releases chronologically to emphasize different milestones in your history. Be sure to also include links to media mentions from outside news sources, as this information reflects positively on your brand.

8. Consider adding additional information --Because you are creating the media kit for a specific purpose, there are other types of information that can enhance your media kit and add additional value and credibility. Some things you may want to consider adding include:

- Testimonials can be a powerful addition to media kits, as they show the impact that your programs, services, scholarships, or events have had on the lives of others. If possible, include names and photos with the written testimonial.
- If your Lions Club has achieved awards or special recognitions, then you should include a list of these, along with a general description, within your media kit.
- You may want to consider including links to interviews in the section with media mentions. Include audio, video, or print interviews. These can add valuable insights into your Lions Club operations and members.
- If you're active on social media, you should include links to all your social media sites within your media kit or on the webpage where folks can go to download your media kit.
- Depending on the purpose of your media kit, you might want to include links to electronic versions of your collateral materials, such as your newsletters, posters, landing pages, fliers, or other marketing materials.



• If you are distributing your media kit digitally, as most now choose to do, you could use videos and high-resolution photos to help media contacts get a better feel for what you're doing.




